

How to Get to Cook Street Village

Cook Street Village is a bustling little neighbourhood located at the south end of Cook Street. Full of wonderful shops, services and restaurants; it's THE place to spend a leisurely afternoon with a hot cup of coffee and a good book in a beautiful setting. It's also just a short stroll to Beacon Hill Park and the ocean.

Option 1: City Bus

Fare: \$2.50

A number of busses will take you to the heart of the Village:

#3 Royal Jubilee - Travel Time: ~10 min.

#7 UVIC or 7N (Night Route) - Travel Time: ~10 min.

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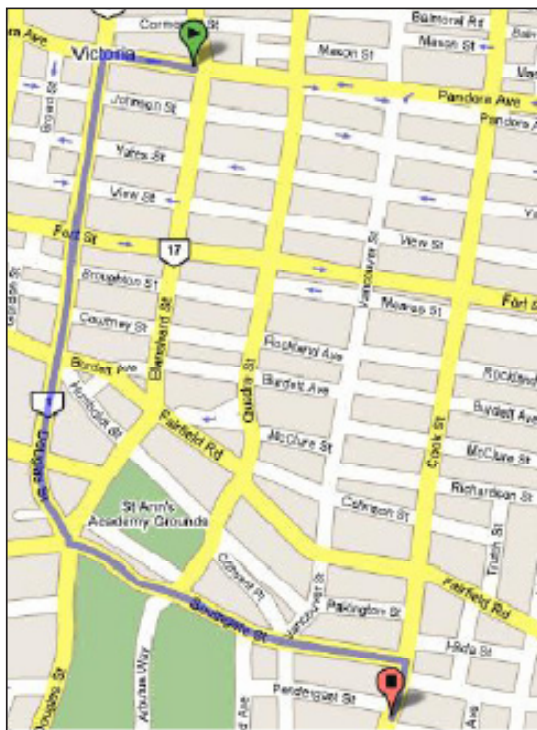
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Some cool stuff in the Village:

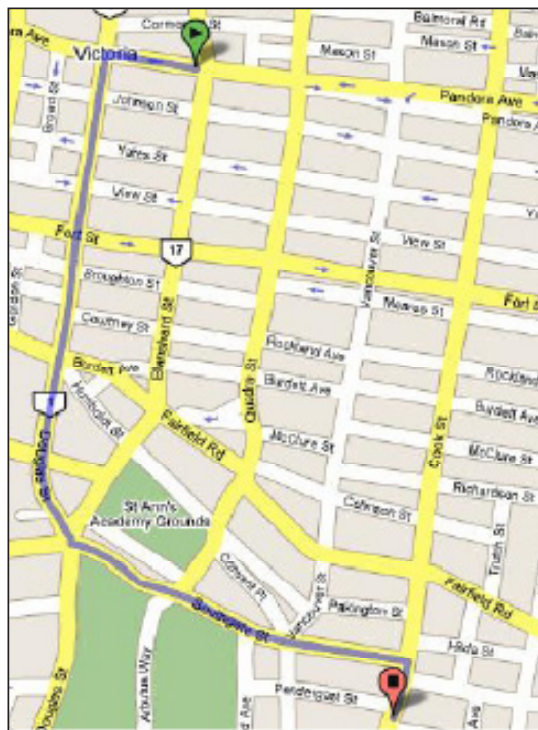
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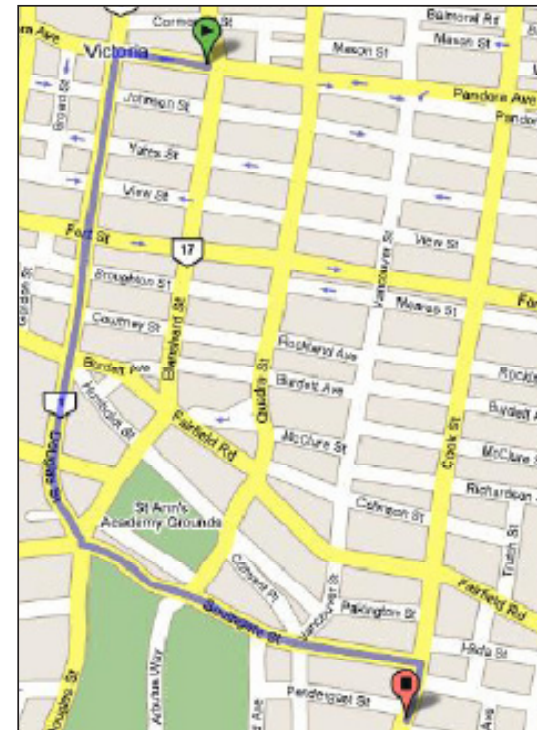
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
