How to get there:

By City Bus:

Total Travelling time: Over an hour

Cost: \$5 for a day pass

1. Catch the #50 from the corner of Douglas at Pandora to the Langford Exchange

Travelling time: 30 - 50 minutes.

2. At the Langford Exchange transfer to the #58 Goldstream Meadows.

Get off at Southbound Humpback at Rock Hill. (See map) Travelling time: 10 minutes

3. Walk into the park. There are a number of entrances to the park. The entrance to the campgrounds, which leads to trails into the park is along Sooke Lake Road. The entrance to the day-use area is at the junction of Highway 1 and Finlayson Arm Road, a few kilometres walk north along the highway.

By Car:

Total Travelling time: 40 minutes

Head north on Douglas St which becomes Highway #1 and after roughly 40 minutes you will reach the main entrance to the Park at Finlayson Arm Road.

There is a day-use parking fee; however, if you park up by the highway you can avoid this.

History:

The area of the park was given to the people of British Columbia by the Greater Victoria Water Board in 1958. Additional lands were designated in 1994 and 1996 through the Commonwealth Nature Legacy and Crown Land additions.
